On the first day of Leadership Camp, all units attended the 10th Corps Orientation. During this orientation, each staff position shared important knowledge regarding their position. Of this important knowledge, each staff position had key points that every Cadet needs to remember. To begin, the Commander, C/COL Katelyn Santa Maria, said that each Cadet should be ready to push to push themselves, work hard to promote, and, most importantly, look forward to a great summer camp. Secondly, the Executive Officer, C/MAJ Jose Verdugo, had a simple, yet impactful message. He told the Cadets to have fun, succeed, and reach high. Thirdly, the Command Sergeant Major, C/CSM Guadalupe Bedolla, instructed that each Cadet must use 10 minutes out of their personal hygiene to better their living conditions, not participate in horseplay, keep their tents close, and not run in their tent area. Fourthly, the S-1, C/CPT Julien Pineda, said that each Cadet must travel in groups of three and to tell someone where they are going. Fifthly, the S-2, C/2LT Tamira Lanzon, said that not wearing masks outside is permitted, but Cadets and Adults must wear masks indoors. Furthermore, she reminded Cadets to report any symptoms of COVID, hydrate, apply sunscreen every 80 minutes, and to stay cool by being in the shade, unbuttoning the cuffs of their sleeves, and having unbloused boots, if it is hot enough. Sixthly, the S-3, C/2LT Athena Askins, stressed that Cadets must be 5 minutes early to their events and activities because being on time is late. Sixthly, the S-4, C/1LT Samuel Vargas, stated that if a Cadet needs a part of their uniform, they need to tell their leader and the S-4 will handle it. Seventhly, the S-5, C/CPT Evan Smith, told Cadets that the camera does not bite. Lastly, the S-6 emphasized that Cadets need to turn in their electronics, which includes phones, tablets, and smart watches.
