CALIFORNIA CADET CORPS IMA/DRILL STATE COMPETITION

- GENERAL: The Headquarters (HQs), CACC will hold the California Cadet Corps Individual Major Awards and Drill Competition on Saturday, 9 April 2016 at the Joint Forces Training Base (JFTB – LOSAL), 4522 Saratoga Avenue, Los Alamitos, CA 90720-5165.
 - a. Check in for units will be held as follows:
 - i. Location for check-in will be TBA.
 - ii. Friday from 1500-1700 for those units who will be staying overnight. Brigades that are given priority are: 3rd BDE, 4th BDE, and 5th BDE. Any unit wishing for overnight stay will have to make note of it in their Letters of Intent. Units will be notified prior to the competition if they are granted overnight stay. For units staying overnight, see Appendix D.
 - iii. Saturday check-in will be from 0630-0730 for IMA competitors and 1000-1100 for drill competitors.
- 2. PARTICIPATION: Only those units that were invited as a result of Brigade Competition Finalists are authorized to compete in the State Drill Competition. Units of a strength greater than 800 cadets are authorized to bring their First and Second place winners for each Drill category. The following Brigades are authorized: 4th BDE, 7th BDE, 9th BDE, and 11th BDE.
 - a. The Individual Major Awards and Drill Competition Intent to Participate forms must be emailed to SFC Dustin Dionne (dustin.r.dionne.mil@mail.mil), MAJ Ivan Mendoza (ivan.mendoza@cadet.org) LTC Belinda Contreras (belinda.contreras@cadet.org)
 - no later than close of business (COB) on Monday 14 March 2016.
 - b. All brigades may bring one cadet for each of the Individual Major Awards Categories. For a list of the categories, please refer to Appendix B.
 - c. No additions or changes to the participation list will be authorized without the permission of COL Grace Edinboro or LTC Michael Smith.
- 3. ROSTERS: The Brigade Advisor must submit complete, accurate rosters for the IMA Competitions electronically. Battalion commandants must submit complete, accurate

rosters for Drill Competition electronically. Both must use the appropriate document for those events. (Word files can be found on the www.cadet.org website).

- a. Rosters must be sent via email (as an attachment) to SFC Dustin Dionne (dustin.r.dionne.mil@mail.mil), MAJ Ivan Mendoza (<u>ivan.mendoza@cadet.org</u>) LTC Belinda Contreras (<u>belinda.contreras@cadet.org</u>)
- b. Rosters must be received no later than COB on Monday 14 March 2016.
 - c. If a unit is staying requesting to stay overnight, they must make note of it in their Letter of Intent.
 - d. Once rosters are submitted there may be no changes in the number of cadets on the rosters. Cadet names on the rosters may be corrected.
 - e. Brigade Advisors and battalion commandants that fail to turn in this form will not be allowed to participate in the competition.
 - f. Upon arrival at LOSAL for the competition, Brigade Advisors are required to report to the S-1 MAJ Ivan Mendoza at a building TBA to review the rosters and make necessary changes.
 - g. Brigade Advisors are also required to submit a consolidated roster of ALL CADETS AND ADULTS in attendance from their brigades to the S-1 upon check in.
- 4. CADET SUPERVISION AND ACCOUNTABILITY: Brigade Advisors, commandant personnel and chaperones are responsible for maintaining supervision and accountability of their cadets throughout the event including discipline, accountability and medical services.
- 5. TRANSPORTATION: Transportation to/from the State IMA/Drill Competition is the responsibility of the competing units. HQs CACC will not be providing transportation for this event.
- 6. TIME SCHEDULE: Please refer to Appendix A for the Drill Competition schedule and Appendix B for the IMA competition schedule.
- 7. FOOD SERVICE: The following meals will be provided:
 - a. Lunch Saturday for all cadets, commandants and chaperones.
 - b. Boxed Dinner Saturday for all cadets, commandants and chaperones.
- 8. Point of Contact for these events is LTC Belinda Contreras.

APPENDIX A

STATE DRILL COMPETITION 2016

- 1. DRILL COMPETITION: Drill competition will be conducted according to the Cadet Regulation (CR) 3-8, dated 01 December 2013. This regulation has been posted on the cadet website.
- 2. SCHEDULE OF COMPETITION DAY: The following is an outline of the **approximate** itinerary for 9 April 2016:
 - a. Check in: Junior and Senior Divisions 0630-0730
 - b. Competition Briefing: Junior and Senior Divisions 0730 (All Team Leaders)
 - c. Competition begins at 1200 for both Junior and Senior Division 0800 for Junior Division and 1200 for Senior Division on the airfield. Drill pads will be assigned for each of the following categories:
 - i. Unarmed Basic Team (Junior and Senior Division)
 - ii. Unarmed Advanced Team (Junior and Senior Division)
 - iii. Color Guard (Junior and Senior Division)
 - iv. Armed Basic Team (Open Division)
 - v. Armed Advanced Team (Open Division)
 - d. Awards Ceremony will be from 1600-1645
- 3. COMPETITORS: Each invited battalion is allotted entries whose composition must be as follows:
 - a Junior Division
 - i. One Unarmed Basic Team with exactly 6 cadets PLUS the team leader.
 - ii. One Unarmed Advanced Team consisting of 2 squads with exactly 7 members in each squad PLUS a team leader.
 - iii. One Color Guard of exactly 4 members consisting of one National Color Bearer, one California Color Bearer, and 2 armed Color Guards.
 - b. Senior Division
 - i. One Unarmed Basic Team with exactly 6 cadets PLUS the team leader.

- ii. One Unarmed Advanced Team consisting of 2 squads with exactly 7 members in each squad PLUS a team leader.
- iii. One Color Guard of exactly 4 members consisting of one National Color Bearer, one California Color Bearer, and 2 armed Color Guards.
- 4. JUDGES: CA National Guard, US Army and/or US Army Reserve noncommissioned officers familiar with Army Field Manual (FM) 3-21.5 will be selected as judges.
 - a. Additionally, ALL participating Brigades are required to bring THREE impartial adults to assist in the judging of the drill event.
 - b. Each Brigade should send names and contact information to LTC Belinda Contreras, SFC Dustin Dionne and MAJ Ivan Mendoza with the Intent to Participate form due on 14 March 2016.
- 5. UNIFORM OF THE DAY: All cadets in attendance at the event must have a complete Class B uniform uniform outlined in CR 1-8. Units must wear an appropriate uniform the Class B Service Uniform (black and white) described in Chapter 2 of CR 1-8 dated 01 December 2013. NOTE: Uniform inspection for drill will not be counted towards the judging of the drill competitors; rather drill competitors will be scored based solely on their drill performance. This is to accommodate units who may not have the appropriate uniforms/accessories so that they will have a fair chance to place.
 - a. Only items issued by the State of California Military Department are authorized for wear. This includes the trousers, shirt, belt and buckle, rank and garrison cap. The only exception to this rule is granted for cadets whose uniform size is not available in the state distribution system. Those cadets are expected to wear commercially available alternatives that closely approximate the issued uniform pieces.
 - b. Additionally, cadets must wear a plain white crew neck t-shirt and may wear authorized should cords, black shoes and nameplates.
 - c. The following are specifically not authorized: non-regulation shoulder cords and shoulder cord styles, non-CACC or not-authorized unit/brigade patches, scarves, gloves, shoe taps, berets, pistol belts, whistles, spats, helmets, or leggings (this includes Color Guards who will wear the CACC uniform without any of the above additions; the only authorized Color Guard addition is to the flag holders for the American and California flag bearers.)
- 6. CHANGES TO JUDGING FORMAT: Drill will be scored on a newly formatted judging sheet as seen in Appendix C. Categories grouped will be graded on the overall impression and performance of the drill movements listed on a scale of 1-5. There are three sets of judges: One Head Judge to grade the Commander and Overall Platoon, One judge to score the alignment and cover of the unit, and a final judge to score the execution of drill movements

- 7. ADDITION OF CRITERIA: Unit Commanders will be scored on their proficiency of reporting in/out to the Head Judge. Cadets reporting similarly as shown below will gain full points:
 - Format: "(Sir/Ma'am/Rank), (School name) (division and category of drill) from the (#Brigade) requesting permission to utilize your drill pad (Sir/Ma'am/Rank).
 - Example: "Sir, California Military Institute Senior Division Unarmed Platoon from the 9th Brigade, requesting permission to utilize your drill pad Sir."
- 8. AWARDS: Will be issued IAW CR 1-1 with the exception that trophies and/or plaques may not be available due to changes in the state purchasing guidelines.
- 9. ORDER OF THE COMPETITION: The order of the competition will be determined in advanced by random draw.

APPENDIX B

STATE INDIVIDUAL MAJOR AWARDS COMPETITION 2016

- 1. SCHEDULE OF COMPETITION DAY: The following is an outline of the approximate itinerary for 9 April 2016:
 - a. Check in: Junior and Senior Divisions 0630-0730
 - b. Competition Briefing: Junior and Senior Divisions 0730
 - Competition begins at 0800 for both Junior and Senior Division and 1200 for Junior Division.

- d. Awards Ceremony will be from 1600-1645
- 2. UNIFORM: All cadet uniforms will be worn strictly IAW CR 1-8. If a competitor in the State IMAs has not yet been issued a Class A or Class B uniform (black and white), they should contact the HQCACC (SFC Dionne) to resolve uniform issues prior to the day of the competition.
 - a. Junior Division cadets must have a complete Class B Uniform (black pants and white shirts).
 - b. Senior Division cadets may wear a complete Class A or Class B Uniform (black pants, white shirt, tie/neck tab and/or black coat).
- 3. CATEGORIES AND PARTICIPANTS: Each Brigade may bring one competitor in each of the following nine categories as defined in CR 3-4, Individual Major Awards.
 - a. Junior Division and Senior Division First Year Cadet
 - b. Junior Division and Senior Division NCO
 - c. Junior Division and Senior Division Warrant/Junior Officer
 - d. Senior Division Senior Officer
 - e. Junior Division and Senior Division Overall Cadet
- 4. FORMAT OF THE COMPETITION: A panel of three or more panelists will interview each cadet. The panels will be composed of personnel not directly associated with the cadets participating in the competition. The interview will consist of two parts (1) a series of questions taken from the cadet curriculum and followed by (2) a cadet delivered three-minute speech on one of the topics identified in this circular.
- 5. CONDUCT OF THE BOARD: The panelists will interview each cadet for a period of approximately 15 minutes. The interview will begin with a series of questions on each CACC standard followed by questions on current events. After the knowledge questions, the cadet will make a prepared 3-minute speech on one of the topics outlined in #6 below. After the speech, the board members will ask any questions they may have about the cadet's speech.
- 6. SPEECH TOPICS: Cadets must select from one of the following 12 topics and present a speech of no less than 2.5 minutes nor more than 3.5 minutes. Note cards will be allowed during the speech.
 - a. The California Cadet Corps includes an objective to promote academic excellence. How has the Cadet Corps helped promote your academic success? Give at least five specific examples of how the CACC has done this.

- b. Next year the United States will be electing a new President. If you were a registered voter, who would you vote for? Justify your position based upon the candidate's platform, and position on at least three issues which confront the country
- c. Mass shooting at schools, movie theaters, and clinics have become an all-too-familiar part of the news in America. Should gun control legislation be a part of the government's response to prevent these tragedies? How does this relate to the right to bear arms guaranteed in the 2nd Amendment to the US Constitution?
- d. Whether you call them ISIS, ISIL, or Daesh, Islamic extremist groups are having a profound impact on the world stage. What do you think is the appropriate US response to the threat posed by these organizations? Be specific in proposing how you think America should deal with this very real problem.
- e. Is the Affordable Healthcare Act (also referred to as "Obamacare") working? Should it be continued, revised, or repealed? Justify your position.
- f. Is the 2015 Iran nuclear agreement sufficient to prevent the proliferation of nuclear weapons in the region? Why or why not?
- g. In the current US political dialog, several candidates have suggested reforms to the US Immigration system. Which specific immigration policies do you support and why?
- h. Explain a situation where you served as a leader during a group project, an organized school project or activity, or a community service project. Explain in detail your role and how individuals responded to your leadership.
- i. Setting the example is a common expectation of leaders. Tell us about a leader that sets the example for you, about a time when you set the example for others, and what effect it had on those around you.
- j. The Cadet Corps is a leadership development program that strives to provide leadership laboratory opportunities to Cadets. Leadership, like most traits is developed through practice, and in so doing a student encounters failure more often than is comfortable. Give an example where you failed as a leader, and what you learned from that failure.
- k. To date, more than 250,000 Syrians have lost their lives and more than 11 million others have been forced from their homes as a result of civil war. Explain the current refugee crisis in Europe focusing on the arguments for accepting and denying refugees into neighboring countries.
- 1. Social Media has forever changed how we live our lives; for better and for worse. More recently, social media is said to have facilitated terrorists' communications

allowing for coordinated attacks. Social Media has also been accused of being wrongfully used to identify law enforcement personnel locations, also leading to coordinated attacks. Identify your position on the future use of social media (pros/cons, costs/benefits) and support with evidence. Develop possible solutions for the problems that social media poses in regards to future security.

- 7. STUDY MATERIALS: The material from the Cadet Corps strands will be used for questions for this year's competition as outlined in CR 3-4. No other study materials will be published for this year's competition. It is recommended that competitors make particular use of the Strand/Promotion Test Study Guides published on the CACC website that correspond to the various ranks.
- 8. CURRENT EVENTS QUESTIONS: Current events questions will come from state, national and international news events. It is recommended to read the local newspaper and two national periodicals (i.e. www.nytimes.com and www.usnews.com).
- 9. AWARDS: Medals and trophies will be awarded as outlined in CR 1-1.

- One Change of Black Dress Socks
- Shampoo
- Body Wash or Soap
- One set of Bedtime Clothing
- A Flashlight (with batteries)
- Any Medication the Cadet Requires (must be given to commandant).

Cadets should not bring:

- Cell Phones, IPODS, MP3s, or other electronic devices. If cadets bring these and they are lost of stolen, the California Cadet Corps is responsible and will not be able to conduct an investigation.
- Earrings, Rings, Necklaces (other than religious) or other types of <u>body piercing</u> jewelry (either worn or on the person)
- Knives, Firearms, or Explosives.
- Drugs, Alcohol, or Tobacco.
