CALIFORNIA CADET CORPS MARKSMANSHIP COMPETITION

1. GENERAL: The Headquarters (HQs), CACC will hold the California Cadet Corps Marksmanship Competition, **11 Feb 17** at Camp San Luis Obispo, BLDG 1571, CA 95655.
 - a. Travel:
 - i. Units are recommended to travel to Camp San Luis Obispo on **10 Feb 17** (Friday) and return on **12 Feb 17** (Sunday)
 - ii. Units may store their air-rifles and ammo in BLDG 1352 cage when not in use.
 - b. Competition check-in will be held as follows:
 - i. All teams and Cadets will rally at HQCACC, BLDG 1352, NLT 0700 on **11 Feb 17**.
 - ii. The Cadet S-1 will have one table set up for inprocessing all teams.
 - iii. Each team's leader or highest ranking cadet will inprocess for their individual teams and make any necessary changes to participants' information.
 - iv. Following Check-In units will self-transport in a convoy to BLD 1571.
2. PARTICIPATION: All units invited to attend, provided that they are able to provide their own transportation, eye protection, air-rifles, and ammunition for the event. There will be 4 shooters to a team. Ribbons will be distributed by individual units. All Cadets participating **MUST** be in PT gear and have eye protection. Boots or utility uniforms are not allowed. Cadets will not be able to participate if they do not have eye protection. Air rifles, ammunition, and eye protection may be available in limited numbers for those individuals/teams that don't have them.
3. ROSTERS: Registration form (see Appendix A) must be submitted by Commandants to SFC Dustin Dionne (dustin.dionne@cadet.org) and the Cadet S-1 (s1@cadet.org) NLT 21 Jan 17. No late applications will be accepted with **NO EXCEPTIONS**.
4. CADET SUPERVISION AND ACCOUNTABILITY: Brigade Advisors, Commandant personnel and chaperones are responsible for maintaining supervision and accountability of their Cadets throughout the event including discipline, accountability and medical services.
5. TRANSPORTATION AND BILLETING: Transportation to and from the event will be provided by participating units. Units that plan to stay the night before and/or after must request barracks from HQ when rosters are submitted.

6. TIME SCHEDULE: Event begins at 0730 with a 30 minute safety brief. Live fire begins at 0800, and will continue throughout the day with breaks for meals at 1200-1300 and 1700-1800. Live fire will continue from 1800 until all teams have moved through all three positions. Targets will be scored on Sunday by CW2 Carter. Teams should plan on leaving Sunday morning, as there is no way to predict how long it will take to complete all lanes on Saturday evening.
7. FOOD SERVICE: Breakfast will be held in the DFAC prior to the event. Lunch and dinner will be MRE's or mermites eaten at the range.

CADET STORE: The cadet store will be open during the event and will have snacks, drinks, and CACC logo items available for sale (cash only).
