

WARNING ORDER 2018-2019-006

1. SITUATION:

- a. Name of Event/Operation: CACC Advanced Summer Encampment
- b. Dates: 23-30 June 2019
- c. Start and End Times: 0500-2100 Daily
- d. Location: Camp San Luis Obispo
- e. Units Participating: All units in the California Cadet Corps
- f. Participation Requirements: All cadets, in their respective units in the CACC in good standing and have parental and commandant permission may attend. Some courses have a minimum age or rank requirement. Cadets attending ANY Advanced Camp course must first have attended a Leadership Camp course (BST, NCOA, or OCS).
- g. Concept of Operations: The Advanced Summer Encampment will focus on ten training units: Medic, Marksmanship, Mountain Search & Rescue, Drill Instructor, Drill and Ceremonies, Law Enforcement, Public Safety, Field Skills, Cyber and Survival. Training is focused on building corps level teamwork through cohesive activities in order to form leaders in the Cadet Corps. Courses will be cancelled if not enough applications are received, so second and third choices are important in the registration process.

2. MISSION: The 10th Corps of the California Cadet Corps gathers for the Advanced State Summer Encampment at Camp San Luis Obispo 23-30 June 2019 to conduct various physically/mentally challenging training courses in a classroom/field setting.

3. EXECUTION:

a. **Commander's Intent:** A training-based event that provides cadets with the ability to learn specific skill sets, while overcoming various team building challenges as a unit thus forming camaraderie, and enhancing the quality of leadership they assume. These cadets will be introduced to new environments that allow them to interact as a corps, while remaining safe during the event, thus resulting in a building of character and gaining of specific advanced knowledge that will strengthen *Esprit de corps. Essayons!*

b. **Training Events Planned:** Medic, Marksmanship, Mountain Search & Rescue, Drill Instructor, Drill and Ceremonies, Law Enforcement, Public Safety, Field Skills, Cyber and Survival. A special S5 Section is being formed where cadets will train in photography/video production and editing. All require the cadet to have completed a leadership course (BST, NCOA, or OCS) offered at Leadership Encampment.

1) **Medic** - Cadets must be in grades 9-12 in the current school year with at least a cumulative H.S. GPA of 2.0, not had any serious disciplinary infractions in the past two years, and have no unexcused absences in the past year. Cadets interested in this unit must complete online course IS-100.b at www.training.fema.gov/EMIWeb/IS/IS100b.asp OR IS-100.SCa at www.training.fema.gov/EMIWeb/IS/IS100SCA.asp and send in the certificate with the application or present it at in-processing.

2) **Marksmanship** - Cadets must be in grades 8-12 in the current school year and are interested in learning intermediate/advanced marksmanship skills on the .22 cal smallbore rifle,

the .177 cal air rifle and on the army simulator if available. Cadets will strive for qualification at marksman, sharpshooter or expert level on those weapons.

3) **Mountaineering Search & Rescue** - This unit is for cadets who have at least completed the 9th grade and are interested in learning the skills of both ascending and descending mountains, and rescue operations. Cadets may earn the mountaineering qualification badge if they successfully complete the course.

4) **Drill Instructor** - This unit is open to cadets who have at least completed the 7th grade and are interested in a focus on drill and ceremonies instruction and earning the Cadet Drill Instructor badge. There is an initial practical exam that must be passed in order to participate in this unit. Those that do not pass will be transferred to the "Drill and Ceremony" unit. Cadets who pass this course will be prepared to teach drill and ceremonies at their school, and will earn the Cadet DI Badge.

Senior Drill Instructor Course: This course is open to Cadets that have successfully completed the basic Cadet Drill Instructor Course and desire to achieve the Senior Drill Instructor qualification. During this course the Drill Instructor will teach Drill and Ceremonies to both the Drill and Ceremonies Course and the Basic Drill Instructor Course. Cadets who successfully pass the Senior Drill Instructor Course will be prepared to teach and supervise Drill and Ceremonies at their schools and Corps wide, and wear the Campaign (DI) Hat (not provided).

5) **Drill and Ceremonies School** - This unit is open to all cadets who have completed Basic Camp/BST. It will focus on how to properly perform drill and ceremonies and PT per TC 3-21.5 and FM 7-22, to a high degree of accuracy. Cadets who complete this course will be ready to be drill experts at their school, compete in the unit drill team, and move on to the Cadet Drill Instructor Course. No minimum grade level requirement.

6) **Law Enforcement** - This unit is open to cadets who have at least completed the 8th grade and are interested in exploring the law enforcement career field.

7) **Public Safety Course** - Participants receive an orientation to many aspects of various public safety career fields, including law enforcement, firefighting, medical, and US Coast Guard. Training may include CERT or Disaster Preparedness certification. No minimum grade level required, but must have completed BST, NCOA, or OCS, or held a leadership position at a Leadership Encampment.

8) **Field Skills Unit** - Participating cadets will practice a wide range of field skills, which will make them comfortable living in a field environment similar to the Army: bivouacking, field hygiene, field feeding, and field training. Cadets must have attended BST, NCOA, or OCS before attending. No minimum grade level required.

9) **Cyber** - This unit is open to cadets who have at least completed the 6th grade and are interested in learning defensive cyber skills through the application of offensive cyber techniques. Applicants must have completed BST, NCOA, or OCS, or held a leadership position at a Leadership Encampment prior to attending.

10) **Survival** - This is a mentally and physically challenging course requiring cadets to maintain a high level of motivation and perseverance. This training is available only those who have completed the 9th grade, maintained a CUMULATIVE HIGH SCHOOL GPA of 2.0 or better, not had any serious disciplinary infractions in the past two years, and no unexcused absences in the past year. Verification of GPA, discipline and attendance are required. Cadets successfully completing the Survival Training course will be authorized the wear of the red beret.

Advanced Survival - Be an Assistant Instructor at a Basic Survival Training Exercise (STX). Must have completed Basic STX and be a high caliber individual with a passion for survival. Cadets that successfully complete the advanced course will earn the Advanced Survival Flash for their beret.

11) PAO - Cadets will be taught how to take photo and video with their cell phones, digital cameras, and DSLR cameras to help maximize the Cadet Corps image. With the photos and video taken during the course, cadets will be taught how to implement them into storyboards and articles for a quarterly newsletter and monthly YouTube Corps Report, and production of encampment and recruiting videos.

c. Goals:

- 1) To create a safe, learning environment to enhance the cadets ability to prosper in specific skill set courses that will grow them as individuals and challenge them emotionally, physically, and mentally thus forming camaraderie within both their respective units and as a corps.
- 2) Goal 2 is to expand and advance the knowledge of cadets in order to prepare them to be successful leaders at their units.
- 3) Goal 3 is to produce a fun atmosphere for the cadets to learn, interact, and build relations with other fellow cadets in the California Cadet Corps.

d. Objectives:

- 1) 90% of cadets will pass/complete 1 of the 8 given events.
- 2) No major injuries will occur during this event.
- 3) 100% of cadets will develop a sense of camaraderie within in their respective units.

e. Cadet Leaders and Staff Assignments: 10th Corps staff will be supporting the HQ CACC staff during the event

f. Application Process: Cadets will individually submit an application starting 8 February 2019. The application link will be posted at <https://cacadets.org/Events/SummerEncampment>.

g. Cost: The cost for this event is dependent on the time period of which the application is completed.

1) Early Bird Price: Applications completed **by 15 March 2019**

a. \$75 for a single camp

b. \$125 for both Leadership and Advanced Camp

2) Regular Price: Application completed **after 15 March 2019**

a. \$125 for a single camp

b. \$200 for both Leadership and Advanced Camp

3) Fees will be paid either with credit card on the Cadet Store Website (www.cadetstore.org, link available on the Summer Encampment page, or a check sent to the LEAD Foundation.

Email cadetstore@cacadets.org to coordinate sending a check)

4) Cadets with financial need may apply for a \$50 scholarship by emailing a request to personnel@cacadets.org. Scholarship requests are due by **15 MAR 2019**. Request must state the need, give parent and commandant contact information along with the cadet's rank, unit, and which camps/programs the cadet is signing up for.

h. Key Suspense Dates:

- 1) Application Portal Opens: 8 February 2019
- 2) Scholarship requests due: 15 March 2019
- 3) Application Portal Closes: 14 April 2019

i. Any applications completed after the close date will be accepted only if there are vacancies.

i. Uniforms: Cadets are to bring their Class C, Class B, and PT uniforms, Cadets are to report in Class C. Class B will be worn on graduation day. Schools that have not been issued Class B or Class C uniforms should contact logistics@cacadets.org. to coordinate getting a uniform for participants.

4. SUSTAINMENT:

a. Meals: All meals throughout the event will be provided by the CSLO Dining Facility (DFAC). The DFAC is able to accommodate dietary restrictions.

b. Transportation: Transportation for this event will be provided by the HQCACC. Each brigade will have a designated pick up/drop off location for their cadets. Parents are responsible for getting their cadet to and from the pick/drop off locations. Times, dates and locations to be announced.

c. Billeting: Billeting will be provided for all cadets throughout the duration of the Leadership Summer Camp, either in barracks or tents.

5. COMMAND AND CONTROL:

a. Cadet Commander for this event will be the 10th Corps Commander, C/COL Friedle.

b. Cadet Command Sergeant Major for this event will be the 10th Corps Command Sergeant Major, C/CSM Thorpe.

c. Corps Staff Advisor: LTC Baxter.

d. All unit Commandants and individual unit commanders are responsible for the conduct and safety of their cadets.

e. Questions may be addressed to the 10th Corps Cadet Staff through normal channels.
